FEBRUARY 2017 UPDATE

Student Affairs at Auburn University houses 14 departments that have the responsibility for ensuring a true learning community committed to providing transformative educational experiences for all students, offering services to parents, and encouraging a culture of excellence at Auburn University.

AUBURN CARES

Auburn Cares received 16 calls to the Critical Incident Response Team (CIRT) in February 2017 compared to 13 in February 2016, a 23 percent increase.

AUBURN STUDENT MEDIA GROUP

The Circle saw an increase in spring 2017 submissions compared to fall 2016 in architecture (0 to 5), fashion (0 to 8), graphic design (20 to 55) and poetry (72 to 91).

CAMPUS RECREATION

Competitive sports had a 176 percent increase in participation in the annual swim and dive event with 188 participants this year compared to 68 participants last year.

DEVELOPMENT

Development secured a gift of \$50,000 towards the Student Leadership Program.

GREEK LIFE

The Interfraternity Council hosted a luncheon for local firefighters and police officers. More than 60 guests attended the event.

HEALTH PROMOTION & WELLNESS SERVICES

Since fall 2015, Health and Wellness gave a WE.auburn overview, a bystander intervention training, to 10,430 Auburn community members.

MEDICAL CLINIC

The Medical Clinic had 4,480 patient visits in February 2017 compared to 4,276 in February 2016.

PARENT & FAMILY PROGRAMS

The Parent and Family Programs portion of Auburn Guides has over 5,945 downloads as of February 2017, a 70 percent increase from February 2016.

STUDENT INVOLVEMENT

Auburn University Dance Marathon raised \$541,832 for Children's Miracle Network Hospitals, a 28 percent increase from last year.



STUDENT CENTER

The Student Center booked 715 room reservations in February 2017 compared to 456 in January 2017.

STUDENT CONDUCT

In fall 2016, 81 percent of investigations conducted by the office resulted in referrals to Interfraternity Council Court, compared to 48 percent of organization cases in fall 2014.

STUDENT COUNSELING SERVICES

The office conducted 1,458 individual, emergency and group sessions in February 2017 compared to 1,307 in February 2016.

VETERANS AFFAIRS

The Veterans Resource Center served 351 visitors in February 2017.
