The Student Center had 209,077 visitors and 542 room reservations during September.

## STUDENT COUNSELING SERVICES

The office saw 503 unique students during September. 1,045 individual, emergency and group sessions were conducted.

The Plainsman's website had a 27 percent increase in the number of visitors in September 2015 verses September 2014.

## VETERANS RESOURCE CENTER

In September, 438 people visited the center for assistance with VA benefits, to study, use the computers, or visit with a VA counselor.

The Office of Greek Life launched the 6-week Auburn Man program intended to educate new fraternity members on topics including hazing, relationships, alcohol, and the overall fraternity experience. More than 700 students registered to attend the sessions.
