SEPTEMBER 2017 UPDATE

Student Affairs at Auburn University has the responsibility for ensuring a true learning community committed to providing transformative educational experiences for all students, offering services to parents, and encouraging a culture of excellence at Auburn University.

AUBURN CARES

The office distributed **OVER \$6,600** in Student Success Funds during September 2017.

AUBURN STUDENT MEDIA GROUP

Eagle Eye TV saw over 53,000 page views on their website in September compared to 15,600 page views in August. A **241% INCREASE**.

CAMPUS RECREATION

There were 2,182 juniors using the Campus Recreation and Wellness Center in September 2017 compared to 1,956 in September 2016, a **12% INCREASE**.

GREEK LIFE

The Interfraternity Council pledged **896 NEW MEMBERS**, up from 870 in 2016, a 3% increase.

HEALTH PROMOTION & WELLNESS SERVICES

This office has welcomed 23 new QPR (suicide prevention training) facilitators, bringing the grand total to 58 trained facilitators on campus. A **152% INCREASE** in trained facilitators.

LEADERSHIP PROGRAMS

The office launched Emerge at Auburn in the fall with **1,022 INCOMING FRESHMEN**.

MEDICAL CLINIC

80 FLU shots were administered in the first Flu Shot Clinic of the season.

PARENT & FAMILY PROGRAMS

The office saw a 44% increase in attendance for Fall Family Weekend from 2016 to 2017. There were **2,600 TOTAL GUESTS IN 2017** compared to 1,800 in 2016.

STUDENT INVOLVEMENT

A total of **9,448 VOTES WERE CAST** for Miss Homecoming this year which is a 53% increase from last year.

STUDENT CENTER OPERATIONS

The Student Center had **243,409 VISITORS** during September 2017 compared to 143,226 visitors in August 2017, a 70% increase.

STUDENT CONDUCT

Total number of student referrals **DECLINED BY 25%** from the first football game (20 referrals) to the second (15) this season, and declined by 45% from game one (20) to game three (11).

STUDENT COUNSELING SERVICES

700 UNIQUE STUDENTS were seen during the month of September 2017 compared to 556 unique students during September 2016, a 26% increase.

VETERANS AFFAIRS

68% of the **596 VISITORS** in September 2017 came to the Veterans Resource Center to use computers.
