

NASPA CONSORTIUM STUDY

Student Involvement participated in the 2017 NASPA Consortium Campus Activities & Student Involvement study. A stratified random sample of students by classification (Fr, So, Jr, Sr) were invited to participate. Data was collected via an online survey in the spring of 2017, with 616 respondents. This reflects a 12.32% response rate. The following data points represent how **Auburn University** compares to the **national average**, which includes 8 participating colleges and universities.
