



TOP 5 TYPES OF ISSUES FOR WHICH STUDENTS WERE REFERRED

- 1. INVOLVEMENT WITH POLICE (EITHER AS VICTIM OR PERPETRATOR OF NON-CODE OF STUDENT **DISCIPLINE RELATED INCIDENT)**
- 2. MEDICAL ILLNESS OR INJURY THAT REQUIRES EMS TRANSPORT TO HOSPITAL
- 3. MEDICAL ILLNESS OR INJURY THAT DOES NOT REQUIRE EMS TRANSPORT TO HOSPITAL
- 4. MENTAL HEALTH CONCERNS
- 5. ILLNESS OR DEATH OF FAMILY MEMBER/FRIEND
