APRI 2018 UPDATE

Student Affairs at Auburn University has the responsibility for ensuring a true learning community committed to providing transformative educational experiences for all students, offering services to parents, and encouraging a culture of excellence at Auburn University.

AUBURN CARES

The Campus Food Pantry had 71 VISITS during the month of April.

AUBURN STUDENT MEDIA GROUP

The Glomerata distributed all 8,050

COPIES OF THE YEARBOOK, and the Circle distributed all 2,500 copies of the spring edition of the literary magazine in less than three days.

CAMPUS DINING

The Dining Styles survey determined that diners rate the overall experience at the campus dining location they visit most often a **5.94 OUT OF 7**, which is significantly higher than the South and Large Public University benchmarks.

DEVELOPMENT

The Emerge leadership program received \$50,000 GIFT to give 10 \$1,000 awards out for participants in the Emerge program for the next 5 years.

FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCE

Of students surveyed at the first 3 SOS orientations for transfer students, 97% agreed or strongly agreed that SOS HELPED THEM understand Auburn's academic expectations.

GREEK LIFE

The annual Greek Sing event raised \$38,000 for Habitat for Humanity.

HEALTH PROMOTION & WELLNESS SERVICES

The Be Well Hut passed out **11,283 BUTTONS** in spring 2018 compared to 9,526 in spring 2017, an 18.4% increase.

MEDICAL CLINIC

The clinic saw 4,560 patient visits in April 2018 compared to 4,262 in April 2017, a

7% INCREASE.

PARENT AND FAMILY PROGRAMS

The Office saw a 19% INCREASE in newsletter open rates since launching the Family Portal.

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT SERVICES

The office conducted an ANNUAL

SPRINKLER SYSTEM TESTING of 23 wet systems and 13 dry systems across Housing facilities, including a full dry system trip test and full flow testing.

STUDENT CENTER OPERATIONS

The Student Center had **172,404** visitors during April 2018 compared to 161,593 in April 2017, a 7% increase.

STUDENT CONDUCT

Six faculty/staff members and five students served on **STUDENT CONDUCT**

COMMITTEE hearing panels during the 2017-18 academic year.

STUDENT COUNSELING SERVICES

873 UNIQUE STUDENTS were seen during the month of April 2018 compared to 594 in April 2017, a 47% increase.

STUDENT INVOLVEMENT

Students volunteering through IMPACT, a weekly service opportunity organization, completed a total of 10,094 HOURS this academic year, a 6% increase from the previous year.

UNIVERSITY HOUSING

3,437 FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS, 376 returning students, 151 student athletes and 654 Panhellenic residents have been assigned housing for the fall semester.

VETERANS RESOURCE CENTER

There were **561 VISITORS** to the office in April 2018 compared to 508 in April 2017, a 10% increase
