Student Affairs at Auburn University has the responsibility for ensuring a true learning community committed to providing transformative educational experiences for all students, offering services to parents, and encouraging a culture of excellence at Auburn University.

ASSESSMENT & STRATEGIC PLANNING

In its first year (2016-2017), **10 STAFF MEMBERS** completed the Foundational level: Tier 1 of the Student Affairs Assessment Curriculum

AUBURN CARES

In August 2017 the office saw **80 STUDENT REFERRALS** compared to 85 in August 2016.

AUBURN STUDENT MEDIA GROUP

WEGL has **80 STUDENT DJS AND TALK SHOW HOSTS** in August 2017 compared to 68 in August 2016.

CAMPUS RECREATION

2,647 students attended Get Rec'd, an annual event held to begin the fall semester at the Recreation and Wellness Center. This is a **10% INCREASE** over the 2,410 students that attended last year.

DEVELOPMENT

Received a **\$25,000 GIFT** to support the new Food Assistance Program that will launch next Fall 2018.

GREEK LIFE

1,610 WOMEN PARTICIPATED in 2017 National Panhellenic Council sorority recruitment. This is a 9% increase over last year.

HEALTH PROMOTION & WELLNESS SERVICES

In 2016-2017, the nutrition team **FACILITATED 553**

APPOINTMENTS and served 166 unique clients, 73 of whom are a part of the Eating Concerns Treatment Team.

PARENT & FAMILY PROGRAMS

Parent calls and emails **INCREASED BY 55%** for 2016-2017 compared to 2015-2016.

STUDENT INVOLVEMENT

SGA hosted an inaugural Welcome Week event, **HAMBURGERS WITH MAYOR HAM** on the Campus Green in which 700 students, faculty and staff members attended.

STUDENT CENTER OPERATIONS

The first floor of the Student Center underwent a **\$578,000 RENOVATION** during the summer months of 2016-2017 to include new furniture, paint, flooring, and Game Room signage..

STUDENT CONDUCT

The number of student referrals to the conduct table were up 66.67% at the first home football game in 2017 against Georgia Southern. There were **20 REFERRALS** this year compared to 12 during the first game last year.

STUDENT COUNSELING SERVICES

951 individual, emergency and group sessions were conducted by Student Counseling Services in August 2017 compared to 801 in August 2016.

VETERANS AFFAIRS

The Veterans Resource Center saw 637 VISITORS in the month of August.
