STUDENT AFFAIRS

MARCH 2018 UPDATE

Student Affairs at Auburn University has the responsibility for ensuring a true learning community committed to providing transformative educational experiences for all students, offering services to parents, and encouraging a culture of excellence at Auburn University.

AUBURN CARES

The office received **85 REFERRALS** in March 2018 compared to 69 referrals in March 2017, a 23% increase.

AUBURN STUDENT MEDIA GROUP

The Auburn Plainsman's website saw **140,908 PAGE VIEWS** in March 2018 compared to 99,875 in March 2017, a 41% increase.

CAMPUS DINING

An average of **311 PEOPLE PER DAY** were served during the month of March at Plains to Plate, a gluten free certified venue.

CAMPUS RECREATION

The Student Rec Center saw 2,132 VISITORS in March 2018 compared to 1,488 in March 2017, a 43% increase.

DEVELOPMENT

Student Affairs sponsored two Tiger Giving Day projects this year. The Auburn Intercollegiate Horse Show Association raised OVER \$11,000 to purchase a reining horse for training. Eagle Eye TV raised OVER \$4,000 for their studio revamp project.

FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCE

In the first week of registration for Camp War Eagle, **2,998 STUDENTS** and **3,459 GUESTS** registered. This is up from 2,911 students and 3,319 guests in the first week for 2017.

GREEK LIFE

The Interfraternity Council hosted a carnival event for Project Uplift with 21 executive and cabinet members trained to work with children. OVER 40 PROJECT UPLIFT CHILDREN attended.

HEALTH PROMOTION & WELLNESS SERVICES

The office interacted with **350 INDIVIDUALS** at a Get the Scoop Green Dot, a bystander intervention program, event on the concourse.

MEDICAL CLINIC

The office saw a 98.51% average score on the patient satisfaction survey in March 2018.

PARENT & FAMILY PROGRAMS

The office partnered with the First Year Experience to host two Navigate Webinar series totaling **3,159 VIEWS** and reaching **3,895** Facebook users.

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT SERVICES

The office received and addressed 304 WORK REQUESTS during March 2018.

STUDENT INVOLVEMENT

The BIG Event saw over **1,300 STUDENTS** volunteering at 194 jobsites, an increase in the number of jobsites by 8% compared to 179 jobsites in March 2017.

STUDENT CENTER OPERATIONS

1,120 RESERVATIONS were booked in March 2018 compared to 822 in March 2017, a 36% increase.

STUDENT CONDUCT

As part of the third annual Be the Creed campaign, the office partnered with SGA and the Office of Alumni Affairs for the second Creed Week. 11 STUDENTS were nominated as Be the Creed nominees, with 2 being selected as honorees.

STUDENT COUNSELING SERVICES

853 STUDENTS were seen during the month of March 2018 compared to 635 students in March 2017, a 34% increase.

UNIVERSITY HOUSING

The office has received **3,671 HOUSING APPLICATIONS** from First-Year Students, 478 applications from returning housing residents and 665
Panhellenic housing applications.

VETERANS AFFAIRS

The office saw **530 VISITORS** during the month of March 2018 compared to 406 in March 2017, a 31% increase.
