MEDIA & PUBLICATIONS

8,500 Glomerata yearbooks and 3,800 Auburn Circle literary magazines were distributed in April.

PARENT & FAMILY PROGRAMS

From fall 2015 – spring 2016, the office received 642 phone calls and emails, which is a 12.03% increase from fall 2014 – spring 2015.

STUDENT CENTER

The Student Center had 600 room reservations in April 2016 compared to 505 during March 2016.

The office had 7 Student Discipline Committee hearings during the fall 2015 and spring 2016 semesters, with 9 faculty and staff and 5 students serving as members of the hearing panel.

STUDENT COUNSELING SERVICES

1,244 individual, emergency and group sessions were conducted in April.

STUDENT INVOLVEMENT

The office held its first student executive officer retreat for student activity portfolios. During the retreat, 85 student officers participated in a Diversity & Inclusion Workshop to assist students' understanding of diversity issues within student organizations.
