#### **CAMPUS RECREATION**

The Recreation and Wellness Center had 12,678 visitors in February.

#### CASE MANAGEMENT AND ADVOCACY

The office received 13 Critical Incident Response Team calls and 78 general case management calls.

#### **DEVELOPMENT**

Funds raised in February: \$50,000 pledge for student leadership programs \$10,000 gift for the campus recreation sailing club

#### **GREEK LIFE**

Greek Life had 390 applicants for Panhellenic Recruitment Counselor (110 positions) and 82 applicants for Interfraternity Council Cabinet (12 positions).
