# **STUDENT AFFAIRS** JANUARY 2017 UPDATE

Student Affairs at Auburn University houses 14 departments that have the responsibility for ensuring a true learning community committed to providing transformative educational experiences for all students, offering services to parents, and encouraging a culture of excellence at Auburn University.

#### **AUBURN CARES**

Last month, Auburn Cares received 55 referrals to the office compared to 42 referrals during January 2016

#### AUBURN STUDENT MEDIA GROUP

Total listening hours for WEGL 91.1 FM student radio station was 6,455 in fall 2016 compared to 3,988 hours for fall 2015. This is a 61 percent increase.

#### **CAMPUS RECREATION**

The bike shop at Auburn Outdoors has seen a 157 percent increase in members learning how to maintenance their bikes compared to January 2016.

#### DEVELOPMENT

In January, the Student Affairs development team secured a \$25,000 gift to support Health and Wellness and a \$10,000 gift to support the Miss Auburn Endowed Scholarship.

#### **GREEK LIFE**

Greek Life added a Multicultural Greek Council in spring 2016 which has now grown to include 19 members.

#### HEALTH PROMOTION & WELLNESS SERVICES

Safe Harbor, advocacy for sexual assault survivors, has assisted with 10 incidents since the start of the new-year, which is an increase from three in January 2016.

#### **MEDICAL CLINIC**

The Med Clinic had 4,104 patient visits in January compared to 3,032 in January 2016.

### AWARDS & RECOGNITION

TESS GIBSON, coordinator for Parent and Family Programs, and SHANNON CANTLAY, graduate assistant for Student Involvement, were recognized by AL-NASPA and received the Rising Star award and the Future Leader award, respectively.

COACH KIM EVANS was featured in the University of Alabama at Birmingham Comprehensive Cancer Center magazine.

TROY STEPHENS JR., NPHC Advisor was chosen as the recipient of the NASPA New Connections Stipend. This stipend covers registration for the 2017 NASPA Annual Conference in San Antonio, TX, as well as \$500 in conference related expenses.

#### **PARENT & FAMILY PROGRAMS**

In 2016, the office sent 395,725 individual newsletters to parents, which is a 22 percent increase from 2015.

#### **STUDENT INVOLVEMENT**

In January, Alternative Student Breaks partnered with the Black Student Union to host a Martin Luther King, Jr., service trip to Selma. The trip included 54 students.

#### **STUDENT CENTER**

The Student Center had 155,089 visitors during January 2017 compared to 142,246 in January 2016.

#### STUDENT CONDUCT

According to an assessment survey, 99 percent of students who participated in a meeting with a conduct officer agreed that their conduct officer attempted to get to know them as a person.



#### STUDENT COUNSELING SERVICES

Student Counseling Services saw 557 unique students in January 2017 compared to 431 in January 2016.

#### **VETERANS AFFAIRS**

The Veterans Resource Center processed 866 VA certifications for spring 2017.
