GREEK LIFE

In August, Auburn Panhellenic hosted its largest sorority recruitment ever, with 1,615 women registered, a 15% increase from the Fall 2014 record.

CAMPUS RECREATION

Facility usage at the Recreation and Wellness Center increased by 9% in summer 2015 compared to summer 2014.



STUDENT CENTER

The Student Center had 851 room reservations during June, July and August.

PARENT & FAMILY PROGRAMS

The Office of Parent and Family Programs had a 26% increase in the number of parent contacts via phone and email for summer 2015 over summer 2014.



HEALTH PROMOTION & WELLNESS SERVICES

Safe Harbor, a sexual assault advocacy program, currently has 18 on-call advocates from 14 different campus departments.

DEVELOPMENT

The Student Affairs Development Team received \$45,000 in significant gifts in June-August.

CASE MANAGEMENT & STUDENT ADVOCACY

The office received 129 referrals from June 1 to August 31. This represents a 53% increase from 2014 CIRT referrals during the same period of time.

STUDENT MEDIA AND PUBLICATIONS

Eagle Eye TV had 50 attendees at New Member Training Day compared to 15 at the 2014 event.



STUDENT INVOLVEMENT

During the first two weeks of class, the AUinvolve website had 11,710 users access the site, a 75% increase from the same time period in 2014.

MEDICAL CLINIC

The Medical Clinic had 6,960 patient visits in June, July and August.



STUDENT COUNSELING SERVICES

SCS saw 554 unique students during June, July and August.
