MEDICAL CLINIC

CAMPUS RECREATION

70 percent of the undergraduate population entered the Recreation and Wellness Center during the spring semester.

HEALTH PROMOTION & WELLNESS SERVICES

Findings suggest that first-time freshman students who participated in AlcoholEDU and HAVEN programs were slightly more likely to be retained from fall 2014 to spring 2015 than all first-time freshman.

STUDENT COUNSELING SERVICES

Nine doctoral counseling and clinical psychology students began their yearlong practicum placements at SCS in May.

STUDENT CONDUCT & ADVOCACY

The #BetheCreed marketing campaign, a campaign encouraging positive student behavior and celebrating George Petrie, was launched at Camp War Eagle.

The nine Freshman Leadership Programs raised over \$13,000 for various philanthropic groups from October 2014 – May 2015.
