HEALTH PROMOTION & WELLNESS SERVICES

Currently, the WE.auburn message on stopping interpersonal violence has reached over 3,423 Auburn University community members.

STUDENT CONDUCT & CASE MANAGEMENT & STUDENT ADVOCACY

In November, the office received 15 Critical Incident Response Team calls and 62 general case management calls.

STUDENT CENTER

The Student Center had 507 room reservations for this month compared to 458 during November 2014.



STUDENT COUNSELING SERVICES

Student Counseling Services conducted 1,168 individual, emergency and group sessions.

GREEK LIFE

In a survey of Auburn's Greek student leaders, respondents said that holding a leadership role in a fraternity or sorority:

made them feel more connected to campus (81.36%)

improved their conflict management skills (88.13%)

improved their ability to work as part of a team

PARENT & FAMILY PROGRAMS

The office launched an Auburn University Parents' Association blog on November 2 to share stories from AUPA Board members and help fellow parents with student career-related topics.

STUDENT MEDIA AND PUBLICATIONS

In November, Eagle Eye TV and *The Auburn Plainsman* had social media coverage picked up by regional and national news sources including WTVM Columbus, FOX10 Mobile, WSMN Nashville, Sports Center, ESPN, Sports Illustrated and Bleacher Report.

VETERANS RESOURCE CENTER

The AUVRC had 246 visitors for the month of November.

STUDENT INVOLVEMENT

AUinvolve had 14,574 log-in sessions, a 29.4% increase from the same time last year.

CAMPUS RECREATION AND WELLNESS

Campus Recreation (competitive sports) served 5,376 participants this semester through various leagues and tournaments.

MEDICAL CLINIC

The Medical Clinic had 3,865 patient visits in November.

DEVELOPMENT

Development raised \$7,691 on Tiger Giving Day for the Auburn Memorial project.

AWARDS

Aubie the Tiger won 1st Place in the NCAA Mascot Video Challenge. He will compete for his 9th National Championship in January.
