The IFC Skeet shoot on October 25th was a success, raising \$1,500 for Gameday for Heroes, a charity that helps service men and women attend collegiate football games with their families.

CASE MANAGEMENT & STUDENT ADVOCACY

In October, there were 22 calls to the Critical Incident Response Team and 63 general case management calls.

STUDENT COUNSELING SERVICES

370 individuals participated in the Out of the Darkness Suicide Prevention Walk. Over \$23,000 was raised.

VETERANS RESOURCE CENTER

The AUVRC had 313 veteran students and visitors use the center for the month of October.

HEALTH PROMOTION & WELLNESS SERVICES

To date, the WE.auburn message, a program to stop interpersonal violence by motivating the bystander, has reached over 2,400 Auburn University community members.

CAMPUS RECREATION AND WELLNESS

Auburn Outdoors is offering two outdoor educational extended trips to the student body: Canoeing over Thanksgiving Break and Sea Kayaking over Winter Break.

STUDENT CENTER

The Student Center had 585 room reservations compared to 547 during October 2014. reserved

STUDENT MEDIA AND PUBLICATIONS

The Circle received 70 poetry submissions (up from 36 last fall), 27 prose submissions (8 last fall), and 120 visual arts submissions (111 last fall).

STUDENT CONDUCT

In October, there were 69 conduct related meetings with students.

2095 guests registered for Fall Family Weekend (October 2-4), which is a 25% increase in guests from 2014.

STUDENT INVOLVEMENT

During the month of October, AUinvolve had 18,210 sessions, a 12.5% increase from the same time last year.

MEDICAL CLINIC

The Medical Clinic had 4,682 patient visits in October.

DEVELOPMENT

Development recieved a \$5,000 gift and a \$30,000 gift to the Student Affairs Gift Fund and a \$1,000 gift to LeaderShape.
