- During the spring semester and Camp War Eagle, Academic Initiatives successfully recruited 1,346 students into First Year Seminars and Learning Communities. 57% of students enrolled in a Themed First Year Seminar or Learning Community, 35% in a UNIV1050: Success Strategies, and 8% in a Residential Learning Community. These numbers are comparable to enrollment last year.
- Academic Initiatives had 34 Peer Instructors attend fall training, which is on track with
 attendance last year. Training curriculum included: the structure of the Peer Instructor
 Program, how to access and navigate the new First Year Seminar Peer Instructor Toolkit via
 Canvas, how to facilitate classroom discussion, and how to help first year students through
 college transition challenges. Presenters from Office of Inclusion and Diversity and
 Communication and Journalism also gave workshops on inclusion in the classroom and public
 speaking, respectively.
