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

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- 5,291 unique students (2,108 freshmen) attended at least one of the 274 First 56 events held between August 8 and October 2.
- Seeing increased engagement levels across organizations. For example, Beat Bama Food Drive increased its membership by 194.83% from 174 to 513 members working to fight food insecurity. Student Media has a total membership of 366 students, up from 273 in September 2021, a 34.07% increase.
- The Miss Homecoming Election generated 28.86% voter turnout for (9,182 total votes) and resulted in Emmy Beason being crowned Miss Homecoming.
