




AUBURN CARES

- Helps students manage academic and personal difficulties
- Fosters a sense of self-advocacy by connecting students with on- and off-campus resources
- Operates and oversees the Campus Food Pantry, Student Emergency and Feed the Family funds, and Safe Harbor




CAMPUS RECREATION

STUDENT COUNSELING & PSYCHOLOGICAL SERVICES

- Primary mental health counseling center for Auburn students
- Fully accredited by the International Accreditation of Counseling Services
- Provides comprehensive preventative and clinical mental health services
- Offers animal-assisted therapy

20,165 clinical service appointments attended by students **↑ 20.6% increase** from '20-21

3,441 total students received services **↑ 31.3% increase** from '20-21

1,536 students attended individual counseling **↑ 23.6% increase** from '20-21

251 students attended group counseling **↑ 53% increase** from '20-21
